Local women smash world shearing records

SACHA BOND

Piopio shearer Sacha Bond ended 2023 on a high note, breaking the world women's nine-hour strong wool lamb shearing record at the end of December.

She sheared more than 700kg of shorn wool and 720 strong wool lambs at Centre Hill Station near Mossburn, breaking the previous record of 661 shorn in January 2021 by Megan Whitehead.

After starting her run at 5am, she had three breaks throughout the day but sailed through with the world record.

Family and friends who were there said it was incredible to see how she maintained her stamina throughout the entire process. Sacha said she trained intensely for the event, doing workouts a personal trainer from the UK sent her.

Next up for Sacha is the ewes record of 452 in February, where she attempts to become the first female to hold the solo record for nine hours on both lambs and ewes. Good luck Sacha!

CATHERINE MULLOOLY

Another Piopio shearer and one of New Zealand's most successful female competition shearers Catherine Mullooly, has set the new solo women's eight-hours strongwool ewes record of 465, as well as passing the women's nine-hour record of 452 in the last quarter-hour.

Shearing at Nukuhakari Station, in what Shearing New Zealand said was one of records-shearing's most stunning displays, Catherine smashed the World shearing record by almost 10 sheep an hour.

She had a quality rating of 10.4, well within the threshold set by the World Sheep Shearing Records Society, and considered by most onlookers as "amazing" considering the struggle with "stroppy" sheep during the day. The previous record was 386.


Starting at 7am, Mullooly shore successive two-hour, above-record-pace runs of 116, 117 and 116 before passing the target about 3.40pm and magic-number 400 soon afterwards, with still over an hour to go to the finish at 5pm.

She had a big team of supporters, including timekeepers and now fellow record-breakers Coel L'Huillier and Daniel Langlands, another record-holder in Kaleb Foote monitoring the gear, and farmers Hamish Nelson and Bridget St George, along with support from father Myles Mullooly and partner Audrey Tamanui-Nunn, and her own partner, Ardy Donnelly and sons Brynn, 3, and Coel, 1.

There was also a team of woolhandlers and others helping with her physical well being during the day.

Piopio Playcentre: 'Leaping into the Future', was the theme for the Piopio Playcentre Christmas float entered in the Christmas Parade – very appropriate for our cool organisation. The kids were little frogs if anyone was guessing!

We start the new year on February 5.

At this stage we have sessions on Mondays and Wednesdays both running from 9.30am until noon.

King Country River Care Update

IT'S TIME for a change of personnel at KCRC – we are excited to welcome Lana McCormick (pictured) from Aria to the role of Catchment Coordinator.

Lana shifted from the Hawkes Bay to the King Country with her family and has always enjoyed helping on the family farm in the Paraheka Valley. She has a degree in architecture with a career background as a property strategist. A lot of this revolves around compliance, regulations, standards and delivering effective workshops, systems and designs. This has provided her with a great foundation for planning and information technology skills.

Lana has been involved in helping her family develop compliance plans in the past few years working with KCRC and QCONZ. And has developed an interest in farm compliance. She aims to work with farmers and make the ever changing compliance regulations less of an overwhelming experience.

"I am constantly upskilling my knowledge of compliance and farm systems. I am currently working towards becoming appointed as a Freshwater Farm Plan Certifier. My goal is to develop functional systems that comply with environmental regulations whilst also being relatable and manageable for King Country farmers. I look forward to working with farmers through King Country River Care."

Anna wont be going far and will stay involved to ensure a smooth transition. Robyn Williamson will continue to look after our "Coast" catchment groups.

We have a few events in the pipeline - three "Exploring Carbon Neutral" fieldays, and a "Trees on Farms" fielday. These are likely to be held in March and April.

"Kick Start" 1BT Fencing & Planting funding - FINAL YEAR!! Together with Te Uru Rakau, KCRC continues to offer "Kick Start" funding for fencing and planting projects to local farmers and community groups. 2024 is the last year this

funding will be available and we would love to see it all used for local projects so if you have any ideas please get in touch.

Freshwater Farm Plans (FW FP)

Coast (Marokopa & Kawhia catchment) farmers remain outside the "go live" area until July 2025 however all other KCRC farm businesses over 20ha are now in the area required to prepare, certify and submit a FW-FP. Regarding the new government Waikato Regional Council have stated "There is no indication at this stage that a farm planning sys-

tem will not progress, though changes to aspects of the current framework are possible." We are anticipating the requirement to complete these Plans within 18 months timeframe may be extended however encourage landowners to not wait until the very last minute to look to complete their FW-FP as that will likely be a costly option.

KCRC are waiting on confirmation of funding to support a series of workshops and associated resources over the next 18 months - we will let our community know as soon as we have more information.

We plan to support farming businesses with existing Plans to upgrade those with required information and will also support those who have yet to start a Farm Plan.

If you are aware of a local organisation that might need some funding assistance for a project, the Club has some funds available. Please contact one of our members. There will be criteria to be followed.



The tamariki were all dressed in their Mokau Ki Runga shirts with the logo that had been given to them a number of years ago. It is a mirror image representing both kura, including all our Maunga and Pae Maunga within Piopio and Āria. In 2014, a combined schools kapa haka group was formed and they were given the

name 'Mōkau Ki Runga' meaning Mōkau to the South, which is a reference point within the Tainui compass and it is a tribal marker/ boundary.

A New Generation of Little People at Piopio Primary School



There have been lots of events happening at Piopio Primary recently. These include; calf club (an annual community highlight), year 5 and 6 camp at Finlay Park, athletics day and our combined kapa haka performance with Āria School.

Something that has been quietly happening behind the scenes is the creation of new mini mes. Many Piopio locals may have noticed as they have driven past the school that the little people that

have had pride of place for a number of years along the front fence have disappeared. They have been taken down because many are broken and rotted.

Earlier in the year, some of our little people (mini mes) were vandalised. This was upsetting to the students, staff and community. Max Laver from Laver Marine offered to cut some new mini mes. We said, yes please!



Mrs Price and the students from room 6 (year 5) took on the

challenge to create new mini mes for our front fence. Mr Laver got plywood kindly donated from Te Kuiti

Placemakers. It took 15 hours of labour for Mr Laver to cut out the mini mees shape. The students in room 5 visited Mr Laver at his workshop at Laver Marine to see what machinery was used to make the shapes. Mrs Price contacted Resene for a huge

range of test pots for the students to create their mini me. The PTA helped pay for the additional paint and brushes needed. Then the design phase started.



The students drew what they wanted to paint and chose 5-6 colours to use. They thought about skin and hair colour, what colours worked together and then got painting. The class has learnt about mixing colours and using masking tape for straight lines. There have been



setbacks, when getting eyes painted and when the painting didn't go quite as planned.

Thanks to Lee Alcock and Mrs Price the class have persevered, so after almost 3 terms the mini mes are almost ready to hang on the fence as a new generation of little people welcome our whanau and visitors to Piopio Primary. The old mini mes that are able to be saved will be hung in the school garden.
