# CHOOLEUSES

Hi I'm telling a story of Mona Mills and this is when she was on a school bus.

The first run was on the 1st of April 1924. 1974 that day 50 years ago was an important and exciting one for the whole of New zealand. With the buses canvas sides flapping in the breeze and its transverse leaf-spring suspension magnifying every bump in the road, the Model T managed to average just 25km/h on the way to piopio.

Now this is how I travel on buses at the moment, the bus I travel on today is not as cool looking as the old bus. The buses today are very clean and not as old as the 1924 first bus, we went and saw the old bus but it wasn't the actual bus it looked exactly the same and everything but it was just a model. The buses we have today aren't as cool as the old bus but at least we have buses. That is my story of Mona Mills.

### School buses

On the 1st of April 1924 it was Mona Mills's eighth birthday. That day 50 years ago was an important and exciting one for the whole of New Zealand, with something like 90 other children from around Piopio. Mona was awaiting the arrival of a rattling model T Ford bus.

Mona Mills wasn't excited only because it was her birthday. There were three Model Ts heading for Piopio that day, the first day of the school bus service. Mona Mills family like just about all of them in the area didn't own a car. The only times Mona Mills rode in motor Vehicles were when she went up to Te Kuiti in the service bus.

The Model T is able to drive 25 kilometres an hour on the way to Piopio. 50 years later almost 20 pieces owned by the education department and private contractors were ripping along back Country Roads carrying 100,000 children to and from school every day. In 2024 was the 100 year anniversary for the first school bus ever made in order from the 3 buses 100 years ago to the ones that exist now. The buses are very different from back then, they are much bigger and have windows unlike the Model Ts they just had curtains. The 100 year anniversary was at Piopio College, all of Piopio Primary went and some of Aria school went to. The principal of Piopio Primary school, Sue Coyle chose about 15 people to ride the bus from Piopio Primary to Piopio Collage. The trip wasn't far but the people on the bus were very happy.
